

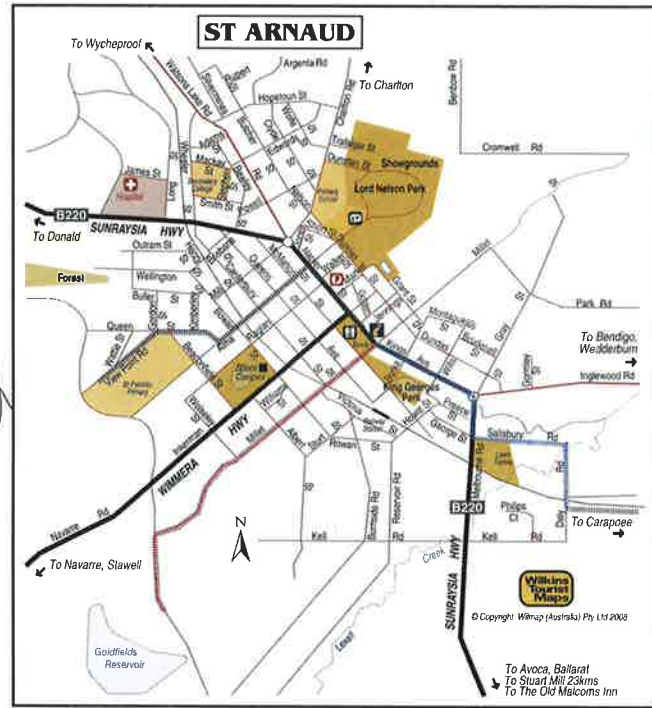
**Moonambel / St. Arnaud ~ 68kms**

• A long, scenic ride through Box-Ironbark forest, following Centre Road across the top of the range with spectacular views across the landscape  
 • Provides various grades and terrains for all skill levels with undulating slopes from St Arnaud to Rostron Road and then difficult mountain grades including steep, rocky terrain to the Redbank – Barkly Road

- From Millett Street
1. Goldfield's Reservoir
  2. Site of the Queen Mary Mine
  3. Wax Garden
  4. Jerejaw Silver Reef workings
  5. East Nook Mine
  6. Turn off Medlyn's Road wine tour
  7. Turn off Allen's Camp Road tour
  8. It's said that Collisons Track is where Major Mitchell came through with his wagons
  9. Site of Benson's crusher. Mined rock was crushed in the area
  10. Stuart Mill/Rostron Road picnic area
  11. West of England Fire Tower lookout
  12. Stuart Mill Gap Road intersection
  13. Fishermans Hut Track intersection
  14. Barkly/Redbank Road intersection turn left to go to Redbank
  15. Redbank Reservoir
  16. Redbank Township
  17. Moonambel / Natte Yallock Road turn right to go to Moonambel

**View Point Lookout Tour ~ 8kms**

- An easy forest ride with excellent views of the St Arnaud township
- From Queens Street
18. St. Patrick School on left
  19. Passion Play site
  20. View Point - spectacular views of St. Arnaud
  21. Water supply tanks
  22. To the right Telstra Tower
  23. On your right a superb stand of Grass Trees Goldfields Reservoir



**Winery Tour ~ 20kms**

- An easy forest ride passing local wineries
- From Centre Road
24. Ziggy's Kara Kara Winery  
Picnic lunches prepared with advanced notice Ph 5496 3294.  
Toilets and water available.  
Wine available for purchase.
  25. Old pipe track inspections ports are still visible as are the hand dug trenches
  26. Basin picnic area
  27. Berry's Bridge Winery  
Water available.  
Wines available for purchase.

**Aliens Camp Tour ~ 13.25kms**

- An easy forest ride through gentle slopes in the foothills of the range passing several interesting heritage sites
- From Centre Road
28. Aliens Camp
  - 28a. Benson's Bull Paddock.  
Site of Benson's Crusher. Crushed most of the rock from mines in area.
  - Aliens Camp: Families of Italian and German heritage were interned here during World War II. Could travel to St. Arnaud but no further. Given tokens instead of money, only useable in St. Arnaud.
  29. Boy's Camp Intersection Clovers and Centre Road. Boys Camp: During Depression boys were camped here given areas to cut wood for Melbourne and given food and lodging.

**Teddington Tour ~ 10kms**

- A moderate to hard ride in undulating to steep terrain through the St Arnaud Range National Park
- At the Intersection of Centre and Stuart Mill Gap Roads proceed down Gap Road.
30. Historic channels to Teddington Reservoir.  
At the intersection off Gap and Teddington Road turn right.
  31. Teddington Reservoirs. No 2 supplies water to the Village of Stuart Mill.
  32. Number 1 Teddington Reservoir is located just inside the National Park together with camping ground and toilets managed by Parks Victoria. No drinking water available.  
This park is the home to rare and endangered species including beautiful orchids.
  33. Fisherman's Hut reminiscent of high country cattlemen's hut available for campers formally used by the local angling club.
  34. Intersection of Teddington track and Centre Road.

**Stuart Mill / Berry's Bridge Winery / St. Arnaud ~ 44.5kms**

- An easy ride on a combination of sealed and gravel roads along Strathfillian Creek
- From the intersection of Gap Road and Teddington Road.
35. Area near the spillway is of the first white settlement in the district where a Mr Sanderson had his residence for the large Teddington Run which was established in the 1840s. The road follows the route of the
  36. Strathfillian Creek along the valley and in the years after the gold rush the valley was firstly the home of many small market gardens and orchards. There was a winery, fruit orchards, vegetable gardens and even flowers grown in the valley. The Strathfillian Creek was known as a good stream for fishing and was one last places where blackfish could be caught.
  37. Old Malcolm's B & B. Refreshments available
  38. Stuart Mill Recreation Reserve and Amenities
  39. Old Racecourse 3kms off the Stuart Mill Low Road.
  40. Cairn site of Carrapooee School
  41. Opposite Peters digging found gold on the way to St. Arnaud.

**Barkly / St. Arnaud Tour ~ 25kms**

- A combination of moderate to gentle slopes with the ride passing between the forested range and Winjallock Hills
- To St. Arnaud on Barkly/Redbank Road.
42. Barkly Village
  43. Lavender and Rose Farm
  44. Winjallock Hills - Birth Place of Landcare

**Daly Road / McKechnies Flat Road ~ 12kms**

- An easy ride through Carapooee State Forest with gentle slopes
- From Daly Road through Carapooee State Forest

Tracks are signposted in the direction of travel indicated on map. Track signposts may not be easily visible in the reverse direction.

Tracks are usually suitable for mountain and hybrid bikes. Routes follow forest and park roads with mostly gentle to moderate grades. However the terrain south of the Rostron/Stuart Mill Road is steep with mountain grades and may require a fair degree of walking.

Occasional vehicular traffic. Surface conditions vary depending on weather.

No fires may be lit on total fire ban days. Including gas or fuel stoves in tents. At all other times fires must comply with CFA regulations.

Drinking water may not be available outside townships.

Public toilets are located at St. Arnaud, Teddington Hut, Stuart Mill, Barkley, Moonambel, Teddington Camp Ground, St. Arnaud Range National Park.

The banks of the Upper Teddington Reservoir provide a pleasant venue for camping and picnics. Toilets and fireplaces are provided. Camp only in designated camping areas. Camping is also available at Teddington Fisherman's Hut. (Bookings essential contact Parks Victoria on (03) 5431 7120).

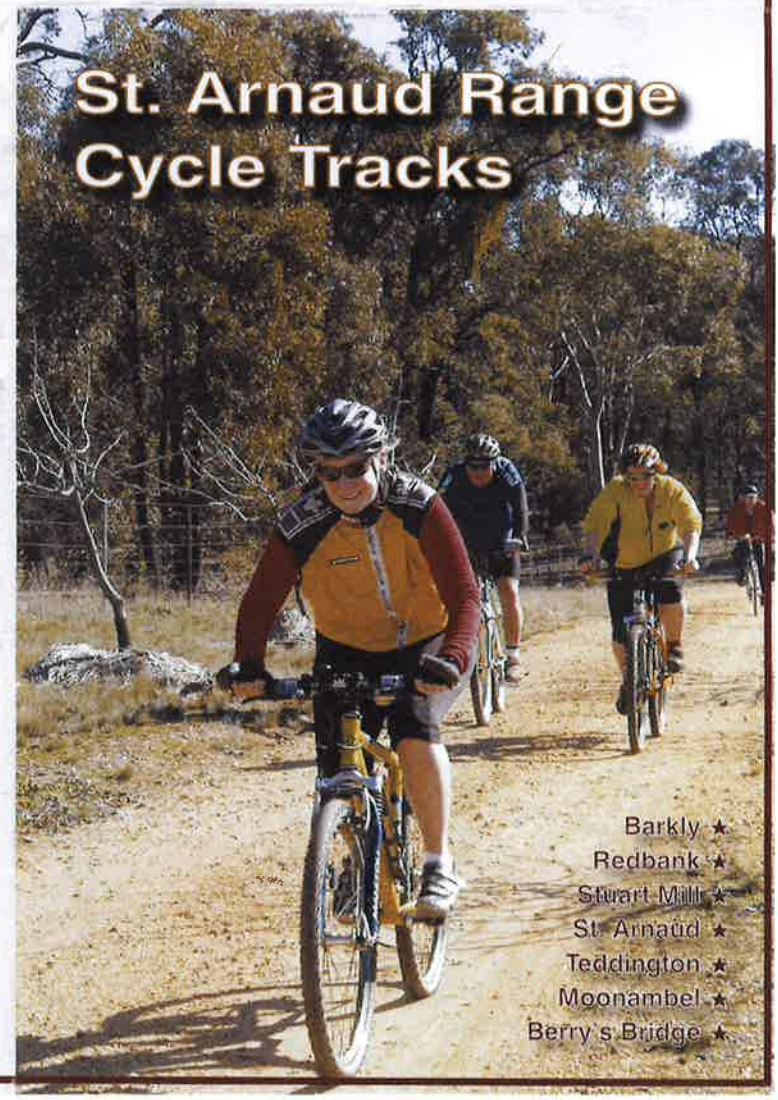
Varied mobile phone reception is available in some areas with towers located at St. Arnaud and Stuart Mill.
