

If history fascinates you, there is no better way to experience the history of our towns (established by the discovery of gold) than by taking a self-guided heritage walk. Wander Avoca's wide main street, past historic buildings, and discover the town's rich history at a leisurely pace. Many of the buildings lining the streets are still in their original condition.

You can also collect historic walk information for the townships of Lexton and Moonambel from the Avoca Visitor Information Centre.

2. Albion House, c 1866. Now a private residence.
3. Avoca Newsagency, 1887. Still operating today.
4. Post Office, 1872. Still operating today.
5. Albion Hotel, 1868. Now commercial premises.
6. State Savings Bank, 1924. Now the Salvation Army Thrift Shop.
7. Holland's Drapery Shop, 1866. Now a private residence.
8. Filbey's Butchery, 1856. Operating now as the Pyrenees Premium Cuts Butchers.
9. Bank of Victoria, 1854. Now a private residence.
10. Avoca Court House, 1859. Now the Avoca & District Historical Society.
11. Lock Up, 1867.
12. Police Station/Residence, 1859.
13. Powder Magazine, 1860.
14. Avoca Baths, c 1865 located at the end of the pines at the Lions Club Park.
15. Watford House, 1854. Now a private residence.
16. Union Hotel, 1855. Now Gollop's Garage.
17. Tea Merchant, c1870. Now a private residence.
18. Avoca Hotel, 1872. Still operating today.
19. Bank of Victoria, 1912. Now Westbury Antiques.
20. Avoca Chinese Gardens, acknowledging the contribution of the Chinese community to Avoca's heritage.
21. Lalor's Pharmacy, 1854. Still operating today.
22. Kelley's Store, 1865. Now Chazen Hair and Beauty Salon.
23. Avoca Meat Market, 1856. Now a private residence.
24. Smells Store, 1860. Now the IGA Supermarket.
25. Former National School, 1857. Now a private residence.
26. Avoca State School No. 4, 1878.
27. Anglican Church, 1871.
28. Uniting Church Complex includes the Church 1876, Sunday School Hall, 1870 and Parsonage 1871.
29. Old Avoca Vicarage, 1894. Now Bonaville B&B.
30. Victoria Hotel, c. 1930, with stone stables at rear, circa 1872.
31. Avoca Shire Hall, 1861.
32. St Kevin's Catholic Church, 1979.
33. Chalmers Presbyterian Church Complex, 1864. The Manse was built in 1869.
