When it comes to cellar door experiences, you can find everything from the tiniest boutique winery specialising in only one grape variety, to one where you can taste everything from sparkling through a range of whites or reds, plus dessert and fortified wines.

Eating and drinking isn't all there is to do here – it's hard to overstate how much good nature does for our wellbeing. If you're feeling a little hemmed in, nature provides a wonderful remedy. The Pyrenees is a place peppered with inspired tracks celebrating the region's beauty. State Parks and Forests offer plenty to keep you on the go with an extensive network of bushwalking trails. Mount Cole and Mount Buangor Parks are located just one hour out of Ballarat and are filled with lush green rainforests with stunning views, fern-filled gullies and offer scenic walking trails and tranguil campsites dwarfed by towering trees.

There are some lovely towns in the area, with Moonambel, Avoca and Beaufort the perfect places to use as your base. Many streets consist of buildings dating back to the gold rush, many now lovingly restored and repurposed into cafes, gift shops, galleries, and even artists' studios.



Less than two hours from Melbourne, the Pyrenees Wine Region in Western Victoria is the home of award-winning wines and the spectacular untamed ranges that give this region its name. Picture yourself rounding a corner on a quiet country road to discover another vineyard or cellar door, another stunning view.

With many local labels seeing the second generation of winemakers coming through, there are plenty of new varieties to enjoy as well as the old favourites. And when you stop to taste a drop or two, there's a good chance you'll be talking to the winemaker in person.

There are 20 fabulous cellar doors to explore, many enhanced by casual cafes, elegant dining rooms, or decks and terraces overlooking vineyards so close that you feel like you're dining





Unearth the Great Outdoors

Explore, experience and enjoy!
There's nothing better for your health and wellbeing than getting out into nature, and there is no better time than now to explore the region's stunning natural attractions.

From beautiful parks to sporting reserves, bike tracks and hiking trails, there is always a spectacular natural experience awaiting you.

Imagine escaping the daily routine by sitting around a campfire under a clear sky, gazing up at the stars and listening to the sounds of the night. Wander on remote bush tracks and discover hidden waterfalls, rugged landscapes and breathtaking views.

Take some time out to stroll through the Avoca Chinese Garden. Located beside the river, the beautiful garden offers a place of contemplation and tranquillity. Walk the grounds of the historic Mount Mitchell Homestead and engage in a tour to learn the history of the estate.

Cool off during the summer months and explore Beaufort Lake, located within the township where you can enjoy fishing, water skiing, canoeing and swimming. There is a leisurely 3km or 1km walking/running track around the lake with fitness equipment dotted along the way. Join friendly locals running, strolling and cycling the track year-round.

For your adrenalin hit, the Mount Cole State Forest and Pyrenees State Forest also offers 4WD, trail biking, mountain bike riding and horseriding opportunities, with many roads at your disposal. Cycle the Avoca Moonambel loop, which takes you along quiet country roads, through stunning landscapes, and provides plenty of opportunities to detour into a cellar door or two.

Be sure to keep your eye out for native animals. Kangaroos wallabies and echidnas are often sighted in the area.

UNEARTH THE GREAT OUTDOORS



Avoca Chinese Garden

Explore Avoca's garden of fire and water which reflects the Chinese heritage within the region. The garden represents and acknowledges the important contribution of early Chinese immigrants to Avoca during the gold rush era of 1850-1870.

Mt Cole and Mt Buanger Walks

There are plenty of self-guided walking trails on offer in the Mount Cole State Forest and Mount Buangor State Park where you can explore the region's natural beauty. Pick up a map from the Beaufort Visitor Centre.

Beeripmo Walk

Mount Cole and Mount Buangor

Distance: 21km (moderate) designed as a 2 day return walk with camping at the Beeripmo campground, however some locals have completed this within 4 hours!

Starting at Richards campground, this walk is a journey of discovery for the novice and experienced hiker alike. Open your senses to lushly ferned forests, the gentle sound of running falls, verdant moss-covered rocks and weather beaten outcrops, as well as taking in magnificent vistas of the surrounding mountain ranges and tablelands below.

Middle Creek to Ferntree Falls Return

Mount Buangor

Distance: 7.2km, 3 hours return (easy)


Starting at the middle creek campground shelter, head along the track marked Waterfalls Nature Walk. There are some steep sections but steps and handrails are provided to take you on a circuit walk of the falls.

Distance: 10km, 5 hours return (moderate)

Starting at Ferntree Visitor Area, a steep uphill climb takes you past waterfalls, through eucalypt forest to the sub-alpine vegetation at the top of Mount Buangor. Fern-filled gullies and extensive views of the Western Plains past Langi Ghiran await, with a good chance of seeing eagles. The endemic Mount Cole Grevillea may be flowering depending on the time of year you visit.



Mt Cole and Mt Buanger Walks

Jenny Clayton Walk

Mount Buangor

Distance: 8.3km, 3 hours return (easy)

Starting at middle creek campground, a pleasant walk around the Jenny Clayton Education Reserve on the edge of the forest with a good variety of vegetation and animal and bird life.

Paradise Walk

Mount Cole

Distance: 9km, 3-4 hours one way (difficult)

Starting at Richards Campground, walk on foot tracks through ferny glades, across the Fiery Creek and over board walks in the Mount Cole State Forest. Some steep sections but great views. Walking poles are recommended.

Borella Walk

Mount Cole

Distance: 5km, 3 hours one way (moderate)

This walk from Chinamans Campground to Ben Nevis is a bird watcher's delight. It was named in memory of noted local bird observer Max Borella and offers great lookouts. As the walk can be quite steep in places, it is recommended that you take your time to enjoy the views.

Richards, Raglan Falls, Hutchings Track Loop

Mount Cole

Distance: 5.2km, 3 hours return (moderate)

Starting at Richards Campground, a steep walk uphill via the Raglan Falls with a steep and mainly downhill return. This walk provides great views over the Raglan area.




Beaufort Historic Walk

- Gallery 127 The heritage listed Avoca Railway Station has been restored and transformed into a gallery presenting exhibitions by local and regional artists.
- Blue Pyrenees Estate a visit to the cellar door will have you tasting their award-winning range of sparkling, red and white table wines which can be enjoyed with lunch in the onsite restaurant.
- Avoca Historic Walk Avoca's history dates back to the 1850s when thousands came to the area searching for gold. The historic walk will guide you to the buildings still standing in their original condition.
- Avoca Chinese Garden Beautifully positioned overlooking the river flats, Avoca's Garden of Fire and Water is a delightful attraction reflecting the Chinese heritage within the region.

Waubra is located along the Sunraysia Highway and is home to the picturesque Waubra wind farm.
